

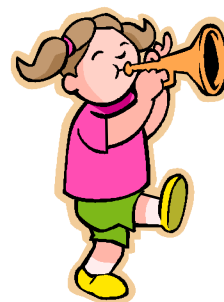

Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Ingleburn North Public School community,

Because the NSW Teachers Federation have asked all members to take part in a 24 hour stoppage on Wednesday in response to *Local Schools Local Decisions* (a new way of organising the business of schools), **THE SCHOOL WILL BE CLOSED ON WEDNESDAY**. The Parent Teacher Night has been changed from Wednesday to Thursday 28th June. I apologise for any inconvenience.

I am happy to announce that **the school camp will go ahead**, albeit by us using a slightly smaller coach. Because we have swapped over to the smaller coach there are only a few seats left for those still interested and who have not yet secured a place.

Our **new computer lab** is up and running! This has been a magnificent addition to the school's resources – thanks to you! Supporting your P&C leads to the school being able to ensure your children have resources other schools dream of!

In the last week, nine in-area students have sought enrolment at INPS and have asked to start in Term 3. This is terrific news as it allows me to open **a seventh classroom**. First, we need **most** of these students attending our school for five school days before I can act. Second, I will engage the services of another classroom teacher. Third,

I will let Asset Management know that we need a new demountable classroom. Fourth, I will have to change the configuration of the infants' classes. Yes, this will cause some disruption; however, smaller classes in the first three years of learning have been shown to improve learning outcomes. *As soon as the new children have enrolled and I can **confirm numbers** I will be letting you know more about the changes.*

My sincere thanks go to **Mr Smith** who did a sterling job as **Assistant Principal (Acting)** in terms one and two. Ms Cady will be the INPS Assistant Principal (Acting) in terms three and four.

Congratulations go to **Emilia Nitto, Marko Papak and Hollie Bachen** for representing the school at the Zone Cross Country. **Congratulations** go to our intrepid Chess Team who also represented the school: **Dylan Bailey, Charlie Ainscough, Hollie Bachen and Jasmine Hojjati**. **Well done everyone!**

My thanks go to all of our supportive parents, our hard working teachers and our beautifully behaved students for yet another fantastic term of learning! Enjoy your break!

PERSON CENTRED APPROACHES LIVING LIFE MY WAY

INFORMATION FOR PEOPLE WITH A DISABILITY, FAMILIES AND CARERS ON THE FINAL STAGE OF CONSULTATIONS

Fact sheet April 2012

The NSW Government is committed to ensuring that people with a disability, their family and carers are at the forefront and centre of decision making about the supports and services they use. This goal can only be achieved by reshaping the disability service system to make it person centred.

In 2011, the Government led extensive consultations on the best way to implement person centred supports and individualised funding arrangements. The *Living Life My Way* consultations provided an opportunity for over 3,300 people with a disability, their family and carers, service providers and other key stakeholders to have a say on how the disability service system needs to change to make it person centred.

Information about the outcomes of consultations held in 2011 is available on the Ageing Disability and Home Care (ADHC) website www.adhc.nsw.gov.au/pca

A further round of consultation sessions will be held across NSW in May and June 2012 to obtain feedback on the principles and options for implementing a person centred disability system in NSW, based on the outcomes of the 2011 consultation process.

Have your say in 2012

The Government has developed a discussion paper based on feedback received in 2011 to guide the next stage of consultations. This discussion paper will be available on the ADHC website in accessible formats from 24 April 2012. An Easy English version of the discussion paper will also be available, along with a Question and Answer Information Sheet.

Consultations with people with a disability, their family and carers and service providers

Consultation sessions for people with a disability, their families and carers will be held across NSW between 7 May and 29 June 2012. A schedule of consultations and details on how to register is available at www.adhc.nsw.gov.au/pca. Registrations can also be made by phoning 1300 550 913.

These sessions are open to all people with a disability, their families and carers including people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and Aboriginal people. If you are unable to attend a consultation session, then you can have your say by making a written or verbal submission.

There will also be separate consultation sessions for disability service providers and advocates.

Targeted consultations with culturally and linguistically diverse communities

We are also planning targeted consultations in community languages for people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds who are unable to participate in a general session because of specific language needs. These targeted consultations will also occur in May and June 2012, with a consultation schedule and registration details to be released on the ADHC website in April 2012.

Targeted consultations with Aboriginal communities

Further targeted consultations with Aboriginal communities are planned for the second half of 2012 with details to be released on the ADHC website as soon as possible.

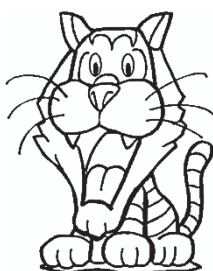


Football Themed Mufti Day
