
I explain the procedures for overdue books with the students regularly as shown beside. If you have any questions, please contact me at school.

Flavoured milk	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make a fruit smoothie: blend frozen raspberries + honey + reduced fat milk + yoghurt
Rice bubbles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Porridge or wheat biscuits topped with banana + a small amount of honey

The simplest way

...to make tabbouleh.

Ingredients

- 1 cup cracked wheat (bulgar)
- 2 large ripe tomatoes, diced
- 1 small cucumber, diced
- 3 spring onions, finely sliced
- 1 bunch parsley, chopped
- 1 bunch mint, chopped
- 2 tbsp lemon juice
- 1 tbsp olive oil

Method

Cover the cracked wheat with water and soak for 15 minutes || Mix with remaining ingredients and serve chilled || Makes a great addition to your kids' lunch box – add to sandwiches/wraps or send in a small container.

Tips

For best results, use flat leaf parsley when available.
For a more substantial meal: add 425g can drained chickpeas; or serve with grilled fish or meat and flatbread.

We are back to school and back to before and after school care with Camp Australia.


It sounds like lots of the children had a great break and have shared their exciting stories. Some children went to Camp Australia's, Moorebank Vacation care and by the sounds of all the stories they told, they had a great time in the program. This last week, the children and carer's have added some great themes to the terms program. They are Music week, recycle week, Halloween week, summer week, technology week, water week, cooking week and the last two weeks we will focus on Christmas.

As part of the Camp Australia Foundation we will be partnering with Oxfam Australia. Our Junior Global Citizenship Program encourages children to care about the planet and people in other parts of the world. As CA's Christmas collection, children will create handmade gifts for 600 orphans and vulnerable children attending an after school care program in South Africa. We are focusing on children being independent and working as a team this term and have added a few things to our program to support that. These things are that the children now bring themselves to the service in the afternoons by walking through the oval to the room, we allow the children to make their own sandwiches and do their own spreads on crackers and when we asked the children what else they thought they could do to learn more independence and team work they suggested a washing up roster as well as bathroom monitor roster and a rubbish and recycling roster. Those rosters have now been made up and will start in week 2.

We are looking forward to meeting lots of new faces at the service over the next term. The service is open from 7am in the mornings and in the afternoons we close at 6pm. Have a great Term and we will see you all soon!!!!


