### Parent and Carer Payments to School Policy

Bardia Public School (BPS) is given limited funds from the NSW government for learning resources, casual staff and utilities (water, phone calls, etc.). BPS is given a very small amount of money to assist parents and carers who are suffering financial hardship in paying for basic learning resources for their children (text books etc.).

BPS teachers and office staff are very often dealing with numerous excursions, weekly athletics, gala days and the like, all of which are very complex and time consuming to organise. When parents and carers do not pay by the due date this doubles or even triples the time spent by staff in organising and collecting for these events. Very often this also threatens the viability of these events because we are unable to offer bus companies or excursion companies any assurance that we will meet the minimum number of students required.

To ensure fairness to all parents and carers, and to help ensure that our limited funds are used to enhance the learning of *every* student, the following will be strictly adhered to from Monday 26<sup>th</sup> October 2015.

- 1. The event/resource and its associated costs will be advertised in the newsletter.
- 2. A note will also be sent home outlining the event/resource and its associated costs.
- 3. An email will also be sent to all parents and carers outlining the event/resource and its associated costs.
- 4. A *final date due* for payment of the total amount will be outlined in the information sent home. Parents and carers are *strongly* advised to ensure that they pay all money owing *before* the final date due.
- Two days before the final date due is reached, parents and carers who have not paid in full will be sent one reminder note and a reminder email – parents and carers will *not* be telephoned.
- 6. Once the final date due is reached, parents and carers who have failed to meet this deadline to pay in full will have any deposit paid refunded.
- 7. At this point, students on any waiting list will be offered the opportunity of attending the event. Parents and carers of students on any waiting list will have two school days in which to pay the total amount for the resource or event.

# 8. Once the final date due is reached no further payment from parents or carers will be accepted, except from those on a waiting list – usually something that only applies to school camps and excursions.

- 9. The children of parents and carers who have money owing for events such as gala days, weekly athletics, book packs, Reading Eggs, Mathletics, etc. will not be permitted to attend any other such events or be supplied further resources until the outstanding money has been paid in full.
- 10. Parents who are facing financial hardship are encouraged to meet with the Principal to discuss financial support. The increasing number of parents and carers in this unfortunate situation has necessitated the following: upon agreement by the Principal the maximum financial support that can be offered for any single event or educational resource shall not exceed 25% of the total cost. The deadlines as outlined above will apply to people seeking financial assistance.

This policy is meant to assist your child's school in being able to provide educational events and resources for every student. With every dollar and or minute that we save, the quality and quantity of your child's education is enhanced.




#### School Banking

## Whooping cough information for schools

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children. Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies. Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.

- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.
- Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades with time. Check
  that all your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years
  and 12 years of age (offered to all Year 7 students through the NSW school-based vaccination
  program). A booster is also recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.
