We were supposed to finish at 7.30pm but the great chat after I finished my presentation went on for almost an hour!

The parents attending were unanimous in wanting another of these information sessions. School Camp will take place in Term 3. As happens every year the camp is firstly open to Year 6 and Year 5 students. This year the camp is to the Bathurst Goldfields and is a one-night-two-day learning experience. Students will be studying all about the famous Australian Gold Rush in class so the camp will be a great way to expand on and cement that learning! If you want your child to attend this camp you need to pay in full \$240 per child or make a deposit by Friday the 29th May. My advice is to pay it off in increments – say \$10 per week.

After the 29th May the camp will be opened up to our Year 4 students.

Places are limited to the capacity of one bus and students will be accepted on a first come basis. Should there be more students than places available late comers will be placed on a waiting list.

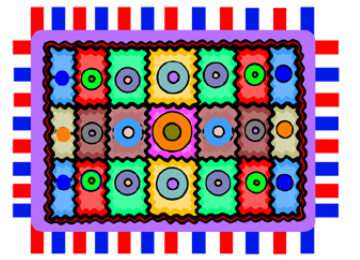

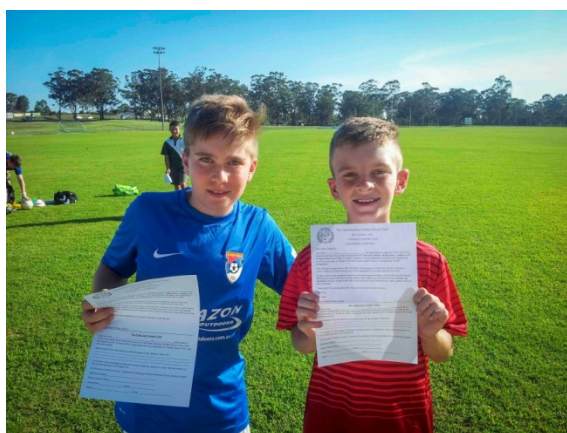

- You can't see or feel UV radiation. It is present every day, can be high even if the temperature feels cool and can pass through clouds.

Even though sunburn eventually fades, long term damage to skin cells remains. Even mild sunburn can increase your risk of developing melanoma and skin cancer...so *always* be sun smart!

Breads/ cereals: wholemeal or wholegrain bread, wraps and pita. For a treat, pack pikelets, rice cakes or homemade muffins and slices.

Fruit: Serve in fun ways; try fruit kebabs or fruit in jelly, and cut whole fruit into small pieces.

Vegies: Pack carrot or celery sticks with hummus.

Reduced-fat dairy: A slice of cheese, yoghurt or custards are all great lunch box items.

Lean protein: cooked chicken, tuna, egg or roast meat. Legumes like red kidney beans and chickpeas are a good source of protein, and a great source of fibre too!

Water or milk: Water or reduced-fat milk are the best drink choices for the lunch box.

P & C Seeking Easter Egg Donations for Easter Raffles

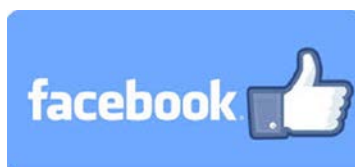
As part of a P&C fundraiser, we are asking parents and carers to donate chocolate Easter eggs / bunnies etc for our Easter raffles.

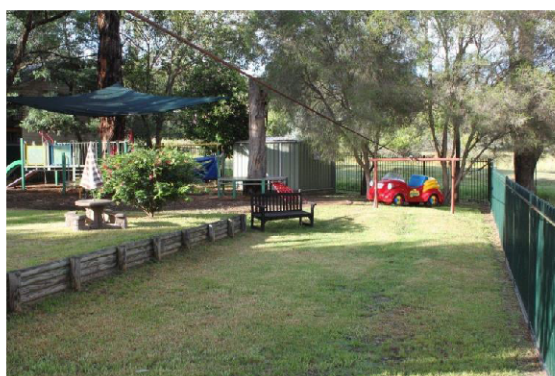
