School Banking



Wednesday is school banking day and students should bring in their weekly deposit to the front office before 9:00 a.m.

Over-ripe fruit and veg need not be thrown out. They can be a flavour-rich basis for some great drinks, snacks and meals.

Banana	Cut in to chunks and freeze. Use in smoothies, banana bread or muffins.
Apple	Stew. Serve with natural yoghurt or sprinkle with muesli and bake for crumble.
Zucchini	Grate and freeze in zip-lock bags. Use in mince dishes, zucchini loaf, muffins.
Capsicum, celery, green beans, broccoli, cauliflower	Slice and freeze in zip-lock bags. Use in stir fries.

The simplest way

...to protect your eyes.

Did you know?
Ultraviolet (UV) radiation can cause both short- and long-term eye issues. Long periods of UV radiation exposure can cause serious eye damage, including cataracts and various cancers.

Choosing the right sunglasses
Sunglasses (even cheap ones!) can protect you if they fulfil these requirements:

- ✓ They are wrap-around, close fitting, with large lenses.
- ✓ They meet the Australian Standard AS/NZS 1067:2003. The standard has five categories of sun protection, from 0 (the lowest UV protection) to 4 (the highest). Choose sunglasses of category 2 or higher, as these absorb 95% of UV radiation.
- ✓ They have an Eye Protection Factor (EPF) of 9 or 10, which blocks out almost all UV radiation.

Don't forget your sun-safe hat to further protect your eyes.

Eye protection at the snow
Snow reflects sunlight so wear goggles or sunglasses which meet the Australian standard AS/NZS 1067:2003. This will avoid 'snow blindness' (sunburn on the eyes' surface) which is painful and can contribute to long-term damage, such as cataracts.

Please be aware that consent for use of images of student's work is a requirement of competition entry. A parental/guardian signature should be indicated.
- **Return of Works:** Pick up of student work once the competition is completed, will be made available on Saturday 17th December, 9am – 9.30am, Bardia Public School.
- **Categories & Prizes:** There are 3 categories with corresponding ages.
Please note: 6 year olds may enter 1 category of their choice, either the Junior or Kids category. There will be 3 prizes per category: 1st prize, Highly Commended (2nd) and Commended (3rd).
Junior Category: Colour-In Competition 4 – 6 year olds.

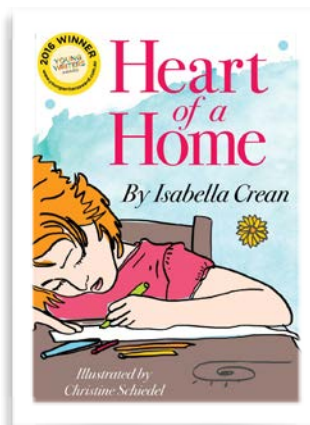
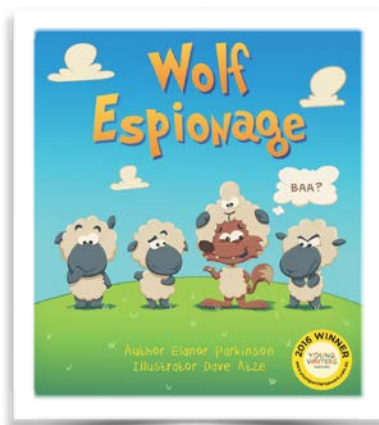
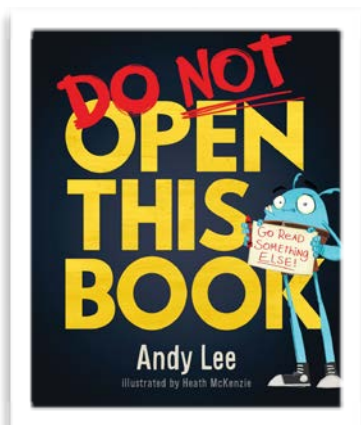
