Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

From time to time our students compete in numerous sporting events at regional, State or national levels. This can prove to be very expensive for families. While the school cannot undertake fundraising activities for all these students, it is certainly appropriate that we hold a single fundraising event, such as a mufti day, to simply help out somewhat with the costs involved. Last Tuesday the school went into lockdown after the incident in the Ingleburn Industrial Estate. This incident did not involve the school in the least; however, when it comes to the children's safety we will always err on the side of caution. Should we ever go into lockdown again, please help us to keep your children safe by following the protocols below.

- Do not ring the school. It is vital that the school's two phone lines remain open during lockdowns.
- You will receive an SMS advising you of the situation. We will send another SMS if required.
- Should you be asked to collect your child from the school, you will be asked to do so in an orderly manner. It is absolutely critical that we account for the whereabouts of every child at all times. Your child's teacher will need to sign the roll as the children are collected *one at a time*.

School Camp will take place 10th/11th/12th August. This year the camp is to the Snowy Mountains and is a two-night-three-day learning experience. In effect, the camp is a combination of nine excursions, the highlights being a visit to Parliament House and to the snow fields. The camp will be a great way to expand on and cement classroom learning! As happens every year the camp is initially opened to Year 6 and Year 5 students. The approximate cost for the camp is \$340 (a final cost is yet to be calculated by the tour company). My advice is to pay it off in increments – say \$20 per week. This is our most popular camp and places are strictly limited to the capacity of one bus. **Students will be accepted on a first come basis.** Should there be more students wanting to go than places available late comers will be placed on a waiting list. At the commencement of Term 2, if there are places remaining, the camp will be opened up to our Year 4 students. **The last day for payment in full is Friday 29th July.**

Please make a contribution to your child's education. The voluntary fee we ask for has not changed for a number of years: \$40 for an individual child and \$70 for two or more children. Granted, this is not very much compared to private schools' ridiculous fees; however, this small amount of money is VERY important to our being able to provide your child the latest and the best educational resources. Please help us!

Please remember that you must be here at 3.00pm each afternoon to collect your child. There is no afternoon supervision provided. If you are going to be late regularly you should enrol your child in our After School Care. If there is an emergency and you will be unavoidably late, please ring the school and let the office staff know.

School Banking



Wednesday is school banking day and students should bring in their weekly deposit to the front office before 9:00 a.m.

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to keep lunch foods fresh.

Food packed at home in the lunch box needs to stay fresh and safe to eat at school.

Meat, fish, poultry, eggs, noodles, rice, pasta, custard, yoghurt, cheese and milk need to be kept very cold to prevent food poisoning.

Pack lunches in a cooler bag with a cold brick.

Freeze items such as sandwiches, milk poppers, yoghurt, custard tubs, muffins, or fruit segments to pack on hot days.

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to save time packing lunches.

We know parents are eager to pack healthy, nutritious lunches.

But doing it five times a week, and getting the kids keen on healthy options such as fruit and vegetables, can feel like a chore.

Plan ahead to get organised and save time:

- Make sandwiches at the beginning of the week and freeze, then add fresh salad on the day.
- Cook extra at dinner and use leftovers for lunches - baked veg, stir fry, pasta and rice work well.
- Chop up sticks of carrot, capsicum, celery or cucumber and store in a container in the fridge until ready to use.

Let the kids help prepare and select, saving you time and getting them interested.

PLEASE DO NOT GIVE MEDICATION TO YOUR CHILD TO BRING TO SCHOOL



THIS IS FOR OBVIOUS REASONS. IF A CHILD HAS ACCESS TO MEDICATION THEY COULD OVERDOSE, HAVE AN ADVERSE REACTION OR BE ALLERGIC TO THE MEDICATION. (I.E. AS DISPLAYED ON ALL MEDICATION “KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN”).

SHOULD YOUR CHILD REQUIRE MEDICATION AT SCHOOL THE CORRECT PROCEDURE IS AS FOLLOWS:

1. MEDICATION SHOULD BE HANDED IN AT THE FRONT OFFICE BY THE PARENT/CARER WITH YOUR CHILD’S NAME CLEARLY WRITTEN ON THE MEDICATION.
2. AN INDEMNITY FORM MUST BE FILLED IN AND SIGNED BY THE PARENT DETAILING THE MEDICATION AND DOSAGE REQUIRED.
3. IF THE MEDICATION IS REQUIRED TO GO HOME IN THE AFTERNOON IT MUST BE PICKED UP BY AN ADULT.

THE ONLY MEDICATION ALLOWED TO BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL BY A STUDENT TO BE HANDED INTO THE FRONT OFFICE IS AN ASTHMA RELIEVER WITH A SIGNED INDEMNITY.

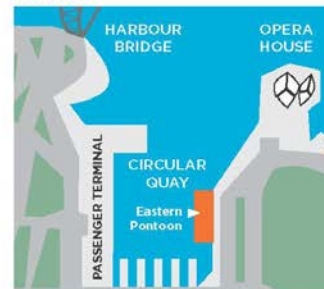
