Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

Keeping your children safe is something we take very seriously here at Bardia PS. Looking after 250 students can be tricky (and stressful). Knowing where every child is at all times is crucial to their safety. There are certain times when our worries and the risk to safety increase. Home-time is just such a time. Because of our dangerous parking and traffic situation (not to mention every school's concern, stranger danger) we have a couple of school rules to keep your children safe:

1. If a parent is not there to meet their child at 3.00pm the child should wait in the office.
2. All parents and carers should park their cars and come into the school to then escort their children out of the school. (Children should not be making their way through the chaotic car park and across the very busy Macdonald Road by themselves!).

At present we have only 20 or so students who actually walk home and about 30 who travel by bus. That leaves 200 who travel by car. I hope you can help to keep your children safe and support us by telling your children to follow these very sensible rules.

Perhaps the trickiest time to collect your child is after sporting events, excursions or night time performances etc. PLEASE make sure that you tell YOUR child's teacher when you take your child.

On the night the doves were used as a raffle ticket and each sold for \$5. In total I raised \$3750 for the Allergy and Immunology Research Department of the Children's Hospital Westmead. I was so happy to have been a part of such wonderful cause. A night I will never forget.

School Banking




Wednesday is school banking day and students should bring in their weekly deposit to the front office before 9:00 a.m.

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to enjoy all forms of fruit & veg.

Fresh fruit and vegetables are an essential part of a healthy diet.

But did you know frozen, chilled, canned and dried fruit and veg also count towards your daily number of serves? (Aim for 2 serves of fruit and 5 of veg.)




These alternatives are a great option:

- when fresh is in short supply;
- for convenience (storage, time saving);
- to stock the fridge, freezer and cupboard, so you'll always have fruit and veg on hand!

Top tips:

- Choose "no added salt" or "salt reduced" canned veg and fruit in "natural juice" not syrup.
- Limit dried fruit to no more than one serve a day (approx. 30g) as too much can lead to excess weight gain and tooth decay.
