Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

Growth Mindset was mentioned in many of the students' half-yearly reports. What is it? Why are we teaching this to the children? Why are we recommending it to every parent at our school? If you want to know the answers to these questions and learn more about what is being described as a "game-changer" in education, please come along to an information evening to be run by Mrs Wyber on **Wednesday 14th September 6pm to 7.30pm in the library**. I will also be there to help answer your questions.

It is difficult in just a few sentences to inform you adequately about the importance of regular attendance at school. Attending school every day and on time has an extraordinarily positive impact on a child's academic and social progress at school. **Every day your child is away from school or late getting to school harm is done to their education. If a child is away or late regularly, significant harm is done.** If you really want to help your child to become a successful citizen in our increasingly complex world, make sure they are at school every day and on time.

When your child wears the correct uniform to school it sends them and our community a message: *be proud of our fantastic school!* Without your support we are unable to ensure that our students look sharp and proud in their correct uniform. Two aspects of uniform that stand out as issues to address are the wearing of the correct shoes (black only) and the correct school hat (a Bardia bucket hat only). Please note that Rabens (slip-on style footwear) and baseball hats are banned at Bardia P.S. **Your support in maintaining the correct Bardia uniform is greatly appreciated.**

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to DIY dumplings.

Easy to make, fun to eat!
Kids will love this do-it-yourself cooking task.



Serves 4.

- Prepare your favourite combination of vegetables for the filling: grated carrot, corn kernels, and finely chopped spinach works well; finely chopped mushrooms, cabbage and capsicum is tasty too.
- Place 16 wonton wrappers (available in packs in supermarkets) on a dry work surface.
- Place a few teaspoons of vegetable filling inside.
- Drizzle with salt-reduced soy sauce.
- Brush the edge of each wonton with water.
- Pull edges together and pinch to secure.
- Steam for about 10 minutes or until cooked.

As well as these celebrations each class will be reading the children's shortlist books and enjoying craft activities throughout the term during library sessions. Please watch this space for more information over the coming weeks.

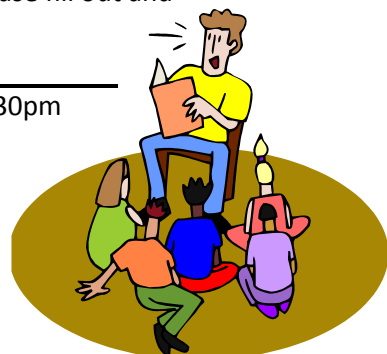
Dads' Reading Afternoon
