Hayden and Emily Brown competed in the 2016 Gymnastics NSW State Championships recently for trampolining at the Sydney Gymnastics and Aquatic Centre.

Emily delivered three amazing parses on the mini trampoline receiving a score of 88.100 out of 90 and was awarded the silver medal. A very good result for her first championship and competing against over 25 girls in her level, of which most were a lot older than her.

Hayden won the gold medal in trampoline with two fantastic routines and bronze in double mini trampoline and tumbling.

One of the most significant changes created by the recent introduction of the School Opal card is the need for students to tap on and off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off, services may be cancelled due to the lack of recorded patronage.
