Also, we had cooked the cheesy Naan Bread that particular bread that Hindos people eating it in that day as a cultural food.

While in week 3, we had bunch of different spring activities and craft. The children enjoyed some painting activities while others drawn their own spring pictures used nice and colorful paint and fabric flowers.

Term 4 Tcaf Program

We believe that every child has the right to an education, however in Nepal thousands of children are missing out on this.

After the earthquake in Nepal in 2015, 83% of the classroom in the Dolakha area were deemed unsafe. Plan International Australia, working with the Department of Education in Nepal has reconstructed and constructed six schools in this area of Nepal.

This program and the activities provided have been approved by PIA as culturally respectful.

The program is designed to be offered in three parts.

1. Learning about Nepal
2. Learning about Earthquakes (science experiments)
3. Creating handmade gifts for children in Nepal

Also, regarding the movement to the school library and as we informed the parents about it. It's going to be Wednesday the 1st of Nov Camp Australia will be operating from the school library.
