### Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

BPS Rebuild – Obviously, the situation surrounding the commencement of construction has involved lots of discussion between Coffey, the company managing the rebuild, Lahey Constructions, the company constructing our new school, senior officers of the Department of Education and me as representative of our school community.

This initial phase is certainly tricky and we need to get it right. Complicating matters is that Dahua have been going flat out establishing new home sites 360 degrees around the school.

It is important that the rebuild commence as soon as possible and that we assist Lahey in any way we can to have our school ready for day one 2019.

Either by today or soon traffic control measures will be in place that will allow you to park in Damascus Street and its adjoining lanes. To ensure the safety of your children and you, please follow these warden's directions exactly.

A small section of the staff car park between the hall and the library will remain in use. It is for staff and three parents with special permission ONLY. Before 8am and after 3.30pm this car park may be used by parents dropping or picking up their children from our before and after school care, Camp Australia.
