Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

Thanks to Miss Lewis who took the position of Acting Principal **and thanks to Miss Morgan** who took the position of Acting Assistant Principal while I was helping out at another school. It was very reassuring to know that the school was in such good hands.

Friends of Bardia – Last term a small group of parents met to hear about cyber safety. The general reaction to the information Mrs Wyber provided was one of shock. Fortunately Mrs Wyber was able to offer some terrific and practical solutions to counter this frightening 21st century danger.

Friends of Bardia – This was also an occasion where I was able to tell the parents present about the development of our new school and some exciting information about the way we teach at Bardia PS. Our current need of additional laptops was discussed. The parents agreed that \$12,000 of FOB funds should be used to purchase new laptops ASAP.

Car Park Chaos – By the time you get this newsletter the temporary fencing in our car park should be 10m closer to Arthur Allen Avenue. This fencing was required to allow for the construction of our new bus bays. The old saying is that “You can’t make an omelette without cracking eggs”. 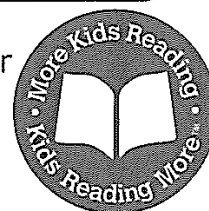

Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online School Portal for endorsing school travel applications and submitting School Drive Subsidy and Private Vehicle Conveyance Scheme attendance checks.

You are now able to manage all your school travel needs online including applying for school travel passes, tracking the status of your application and tracking the status of your School Drive Subsidy application and payments.

The application process has also been simplified so that a new or updated application for school travel passes is only needed when a student is:

- applying for a school travel pass for the first time
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).
- changing school or campus
- changing home address
- receiving an expiry notification
- repeating a school year
- changing their name
- requesting a new transport operator.

This means students who are progressing to year 3 and year 7 only need to reapply if they are changing circumstances.

Students who are not residents and are temporarily in Australia can also provide their visa subclass number or exchange program when applying online, making the application and approval process much faster.

Note: Student attendance checks will be available for completion by schools after the last day of semester (1 July 2017).
