Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

You are encouraged to join your child's class parent group. Often parents ask me what is the most important thing in **ensuring their child gets a good education**. The answer is simple: **attendance**. Your child being at school every school day and arriving on time ready to learn has an amazingly positive impact on their learning.

Please note that **the police have increased patrols around our school**. To my knowledge three people have been booked doing a u-turn over double lines in our school zone during 40kph times in the last two weeks, an \$800 fine!

Please note that rather than the teachers undertaking two staff development days at the end of the year (when we are exhausted) we will instead be having four professional development nights throughout the year. Professional development for teachers is extremely important. The more skilled your child's teacher, the more your child will learn!

Traffic Management – latest news!

Please note the following change to the Bardia car parking rules:

Parents dropping their children off at Camp Australia (our before and after school care) may enter the little car park near my office BEFORE 7.15am ONLY.

Drivers may move into vacant spots along the kiss and ride zones. You do not have to wait in line. Drivers exiting the kiss and ride zones please keep a sharp eye out for cars attempting to pull in front of you to use the kiss and ride.

Pedestrians can walk in front of the construction zone entrance at the corner of old Macdonald Road and Arthur Allen Drive in the morning and afternoon. Please follow the traffic controller's directions.

Please note that the traffic controllers change regularly. Should they disagree with the rules above please tell them that the principal and Shane have agreed on these rules and they should check. Please be patient with them!

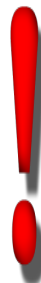
LOST PROPERTY

Hummus
