Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

## Traffic Management – latest news!

Please note the following change to the Bardia car parking rules:

**Parents dropping their children off at Camp Australia (our before and after school care) may enter the little car park near my office BEFORE 7.15am ONLY.**
