Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

As you will no doubt have seen, **the school rebuild** is progressing very rapidly. With so few rain interruptions, it is very likely that we will make our move to the new facilities very early in November!

Next week is **NAPLAN week**. For those of you with children in Year 3 or Year 5 please ensure they are at school before 9am each day. Please also note that NAPLAN should NOT be regarded as a stressful test. It was designed to be a brief "snapshot" of your child's learning. It was never meant to be a high-stakes test or a test for comparing schools. The fact that NAPLAN has morphed into this has many educationalists calling for it to be removed. I believe that we should not overstate its importance and just focus on the useful information it provides teachers. My advice is that you tell your children to have fun simply doing the best they can.

Did you know that keeping your child at home unnecessarily or allowing them to come late to school regularly could result in legal action? The school is required to communicate with the parents of students whose attendance is of concern, to engage the services of a Home School Liaison Officer if the child's attendance does not improve and let the Department of Family and Community Services know when we believe that parents are engaged in educational neglect.

Some good news. **Bambi Kindergarten** is likely to move to a new location in 2019. While it is disappointing that Bardia will lose this wonderful facility, I am pleased to see that they will be able to continue providing their extraordinary service.

Dymocks Children's Charities Book Bonus

This year we are participating in 2018 Book Bonus. This program allows students to gain sponsors for completing the PRC.

How does it work?

Our students involved in the 2018 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge can join Book Bonus by registering online at <https://donate.grassrootz.com/dymocks/book-bonus-2018/bardia-public-school>. Once you have created your own Book Bonus page, you can seek sponsorship, add photos, track donations and update your progress.

How does Book Bonus benefit our school?

Dymocks Children's Charities will match the total raised by each student and school, plus a bonus 25%, to go towards new books chosen by your school. So, for every \$1 raised that's \$1.25 worth of new books for our school!

How does Book Bonus benefit others?

Dymocks Children's Charities will also award an additional 25% of the amount raised to schools in need so they can also select new books for their students.

For example, the rewards if our students collectively raise \$2,000 will be:

- **\$2,500** in books chosen by your school from an extensive list
- **\$500** in books will be rewarded to schools in need so they can select new books for their students

How are our students rewarded?

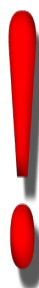
Stewart House Bags

The school is a member of the Amart All Sports Community Kickbacks Program. Customers of Amart All Sports can elect Bardia Public School to receive credits against purchases made.

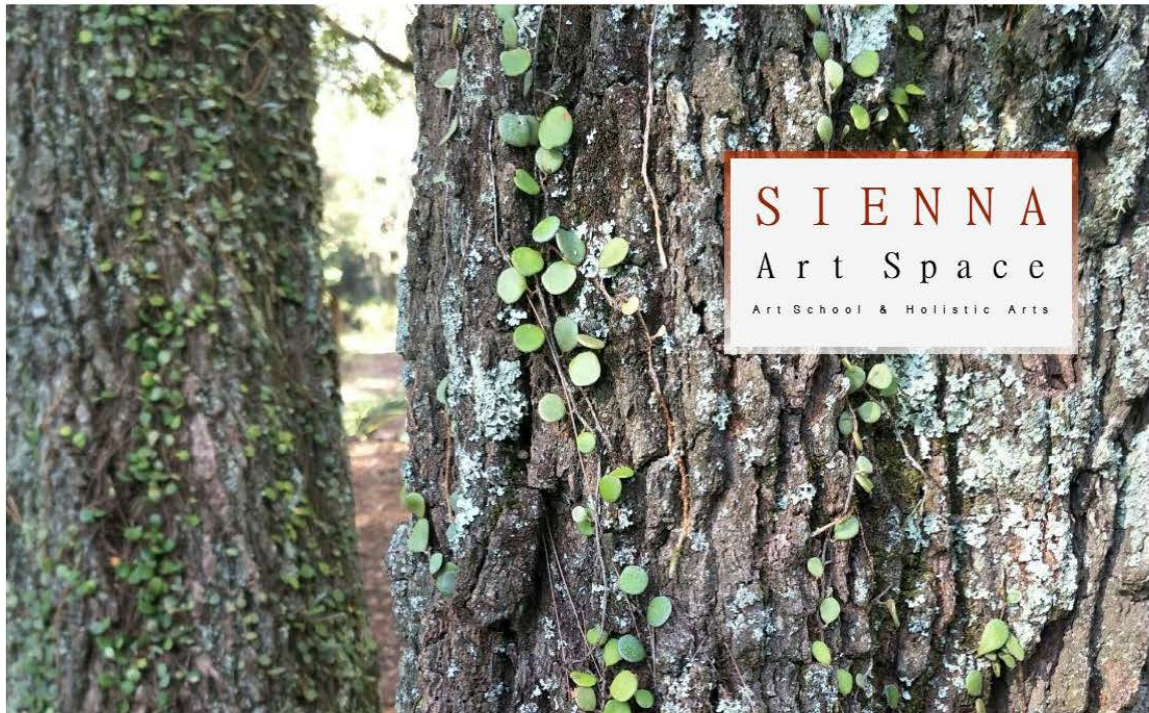
You will need to join the Amart All Sports Team Amart Loyalty Program and nominate Bardia Public School as your “Relevant Participating Club or School”.

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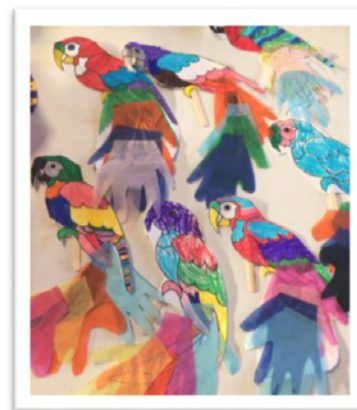


Tips for easing kids into Outside School Hours Care
