### Message from the Principal

Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

**Thank you everyone for your patience, your understanding and your flexibility as we deal with the numerous issues affecting our school because of the rebuild.** Please be patient with other drivers. Of course, different drivers have different levels of driving skill and they may simply be doing the best they can.

Please remember that if you are dropping your child at our before and after school care you may enter the little staff carpark near my office **before** 7.20am.

**You must not enter the little carpark next to my office after 7.20am.** This is an extremely dangerous thing to do. Parents who have done this exit the carpark as teachers arrive and put lives at risk. We have had two serious incidents already and we have been lucky no one has been injured. *Should parents continue to enter the carpark after 7.15am, I will have no choice but to keep the gates locked to everyone except staff.*

**Hang in there folks, our getting brand new facilities will be worth the hassle!**

Did you know that keeping your child at home unnecessarily or allowing them to come late to school regularly could result in legal action? The school is required to communicate with the parents of students whose attendance is of concern, to engage the services of a Home School Liaison Officer if the child's attendance does not improve and let the Department of Family and Community Services know when we believe that parents are engaged in educational neglect.

## **Dymocks Children's Charities Book Bonus**

### **How does it work?**

Our students involved in the 2018 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge can join Book Bonus by registering online at <https://donate.grassrootz.com/dymocks/book-bonus-2018/bardia-public-school>. Once you have created your own Book Bonus page you can seek sponsorship, add photos, track donations and update your progress.

### **How does Book Bonus benefit our school?**

Dymocks Children's Charities will match the total raised by each student and school, plus a bonus 25%, to go towards new books chosen by your school. So, for every \$1 raised that's \$1.25 worth of new books for our school!

### **How does Book Bonus benefit others?**

Dymocks Children's Charities will also award an additional 25% of the amount raised to schools in need so they can also select new books for their students.

For example, the rewards if our students collectively raise \$2,000 will be:

- **\$2,500** in books chosen by our school from an extensive list
- **\$500** in books will be rewarded to schools in need so they can select new books for their students

**The 5 most successful school fundraisers** will receive a bonus \$1,000 value of books each. That's \$5,000 value of books!

### **How are our students rewarded?**

Dymocks Children's Charities will reward our students with bonuses for their fundraising efforts.

The school is a member of the Amart All Sports Community Kickbacks Program. Customers of Amart All Sports can elect Bardia Public School to receive credits against purchases made.

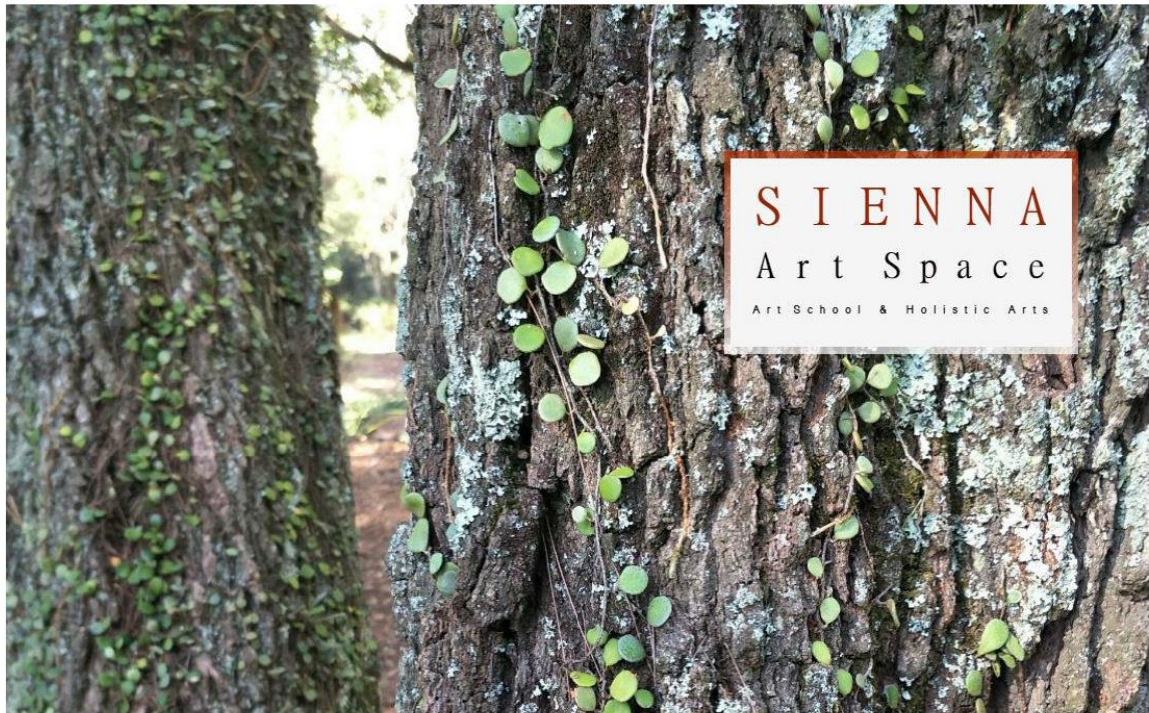
You will need to join the Amart All Sports Team Amart Loyalty Program and nominate Bardia Public School as your "Relevant Participating Club or School".

### The new Child Care Subsidy, and what it means for you

On the 2nd of July, the Australian Government will transition to a new Child Care Subsidy (CCS). This will replace the existing Child Care Rebate (CCR) and Child Care Benefit (CCB).

There are a number of key changes that families who rely on childcare before and/or after school need to know, including:

- Any benefit will be paid directly to child care providers (like Camp Australia), who will then only bill the 'gap' amount to families.
- There will continue to be hardship relief.
- For families earning less than \$186,958, there will no longer be an annual cap on the amount of subsidy you can receive. For families earning between \$186,958 and \$351,248, an increased annual subsidy cap of \$10,000 per child will apply each year.
