### **How does Book Bonus benefit our school?**

In After School Care we love cooking healthy, delicious meals and snacks from our Healthy Eating Cookbook. All the recipes in our cookbook support our healthy eating program and are officially endorsed by Nutrition Australia. Nachos is a popular recipe from the cookbook, so we thought we'd share the recipe with you to try at home.

#### Nachos #

Nachos are associated with Mexican food. It is thought this dish was first served in 1943.

#### Ingredients

- ◆ 1 packet of original corn chips
- ◆ 1 tin of Kidney beans (drained and rinsed with water)
- ◆ 1 tin of corn (drained)
- ◆ ¼ cup grated reduced fat cheese
- ◆ ¼ cup salsa
- ◆ Use any vegetables provided e.g. lettuce, capsicums as topping

#### Method

1. Refrigerate the cheese provided for 5 mins so that it is easier to grate
2. On a microwave plate arrange corn chips in a single layer
3. Top with kidney beans and grated cheese
4. Microwave uncovered on High for approx. 1 minute, until heated and cheese has melted.
5. Top with salsa and toppings .

## Land Sales Eclipse The 800 Mark

New Breeze continue to lead demand for land in the south west with over 800 land sales now secured, valued at over \$350 million. The market is slowing in several areas across Sydney, however New Breeze is not witnessing those signs. More than 15,000 people have registered on the database to receive project updates. ## Welcome

The last six months has been very busy at New Breeze. Construction is well underway on the first homes, Stage 2 subdivision works are progressing well, Stage 3 subdivision activity will start in June and the upgrade and extension to Bardia Park will finish in June. Thousands of native trees and shrubs will soon be planted in Memorial Forest Reserve as well as construction of a water quality facility.

Thousands of construction jobs are being created to build new roads, homes and public facilities. Cranes and bulldozers are highly visible on two major state-of-the-art amenities including Bardia Public School and Edmondson Park Town Centre. New Breeze is located across the road and beside these significant facilities.

We are also pleased to announce that Campbelltown City Council has granted development approval for Stage 3, aptly named Parkside. Parkside will comprise 700 land lots and two expansive public open spaces – Ingleburn Park and the Northern Corridor. Construction is expected to commence on the park and corridor in August. Open spaces play an integral role in helping promote active, healthy lifestyles and building a strong sense of community.

Approval for Parkside is an important milestone for the development. Land and house and land packages are selling rapidly in New Breeze. We are constantly replenishing new land to meet high demand from purchasers. Our signature Parkside Residences range will soon be revealed.

A further development application (DA) has also been lodged with Council for a major recreational playing area spanning 50,500 sqm hectares in Parkside called Maxwell Creek Oval. Approval of the DA is expected in the first half of 2018.

## Place Design Group Unveils Parkside

Renowned landscape architects – Place Design Group has unveiled its designs for two expansive public open spaces – Ingleburn Park and the Northern Corridor. Ingleburn Park, comprises over 4,125 sqm and will be an active recreational area featuring a climbing wall, fireman poles, climbing net, slides, play equipment, shelter and seat walling.

The Northern Corridor spanning 20,500 sqm will act as a passive and active recreational precinct with open multi-function green spaces, footpaths, cycleways and shelters. Landscaping, native plants and shade trees will intertwine in the corridor.

Recreational pursuits such as soccer, rugby, cricket, frisbee throwing and picnics will be enjoyed in the open spaces. Ingleburn Park also plays an important part in the 'green network' at New Breeze, connecting pedestrians and cyclists with the sports precinct to the east and Ingleburn Park to the west.

## Multi-Million Dollar Transformation – Bardia Public School

A few short years ago, Bardia Public School was a small semi-rural school serving the educational needs of approximately 150 students. The school now has a student enrolment of 330 and is expected to increase by approximately 100 students per year, reaching a capacity of 1,000 students by 2022.

In response to this growth, the NSW state government has allocated approximately \$35 million to upgrade the existing school to create a state-of-the-art educational facility, which is expected to open in 2019. New Breeze is located immediately beside Bardia Public School. Many families living in the community are expected to enjoy the convenience of walking their children to the new 21st century school.

## Vision For City's Future

Campbelltown City Council recently unveiled its plan to create 'Australia's greenest city' as it kick-starts a new employment and investment initiative aimed at attracting and supporting the next generation of jobs, homes and lifestyles, for one of the fastest growing economic regions in the country. The draft report compiled by one of the world's leading consultants suggests that Macarthur will be home to an additional 800,000 people within the next 25 years.
