Dear members of the Bardia Public School community,

Welcome back to Term 4! This is sure to be another busy term as we head towards the end of the year.

Kindergarten Orientation – Our Kinder Orientation program begins on the 12th November. Invitations have been sent out to all families who have enrolled for next year. If you have a child starting Kindergarten in 2020 and have not yet seen the office to start the enrolment process, please do so as soon as possible.

Library News

Welcome back to Term 4!

This term will continue with the library program where each hub comes to the library for 1 hour to borrow, read and enjoy listening to literature and for K-2 to participate in craft activities to do with the focus text.

K-2 have additional time in the library for team teaching Guided Inquiry where they will be using technology along with other activities to explore units of work. Kindergarten will be looking at road safety while Years 1 & 2 will be doing a geography unit called Local and Global Places. Look out for exciting activities going on in the library this term...



Silent Sustained Reading

What is it and how is it vital to your child's reading development?

Silent Sustained Reading (SSR) is when a child reads one book for an age appropriate extended time. The recommended time for a child is double their age.

SSR is vital to a child's reading development as it:

Enhances Reading Enjoyment

Readers choose their books so children can pick books of interest. When they are given the freedom to choose, kids discover stories that appeal to them and they develop a positive attitude toward reading. They are reading for the pure joy of reading.

Increases Comprehension

During SSR children don't have to pay as much attention to the pronunciation of every single word when they read silently, so they can concentrate on reading for understanding. As vocabulary, fluency and motivation increase so does comprehension. They can visualise and interpret the words in their own way. Having time to share what they have read develop this further.

Builds Vocabulary

SSR reading provides the opportunity to learn the meanings of many new words in context. Children will apply the word attack skills they've learned to figure out new words on their own.

Improves Writing Skills

There is a well-established link between reading and writing. When children are engrossed in silent reading, they observe a variety of writing styles and sentence structures that influence their own writing styles. Consistent, independent reading inspires a creative thought process that transfers to the written word.

During library time this term we will be focusing on and developing the student's SSR.

How can you help?

Read to your child every day for enjoyment and talk about the stories you read together. Allow and encourage time for them to read by themselves. Perhaps you can set aside a time when you both read silently, set a timer, short intervals at first and read next to each other. If the child wants to talk about their book before the timer is up remind them you will talk after the timer.

Mostly enjoy reading together.

Overdue Books

If your child attends the library and borrows, which will be every child in our school, then they will likely have an overdue book at some time. It is normal for children to forget and misplace things and we as adults are there to guide and help them, not do things for them, even when they are 5 years old.

Some parents become distressed when their child has an overdue book. For us in the library it's not a problem as the books always turn up. Rarely do we ask for payment but for parents to help the child check for the book at home.

Occasionally the book is lost in the library or in the classroom and when the parent informs us we can also look for the book at school.


To sum up, if your child has an overdue book, don't panic, stay calm, have them check your home and then contact us in the library if you haven't found it and we will go from there. Unless your child has many books overdue they will still be able to borrow.

Campbelltown Road upgrade

Temporary closure of Soldiers Parade at Campbelltown Road, Edmondson Park

Roads and Maritime Services | October 2019

The NSW Government is investing \$76 million to upgrade Campbelltown Road between Zouch Road and Ingleburn Gardens Drive, Bardia. The upgrade will improve safety and access to Campbelltown Road, and increase road capacity to cater for future growth.



As part of this upgrade, we will carry out work at the intersection of Soldiers Parade at Campbelltown Road, Edmondson Park. The work will include earthwork, trenching and installing services, road surface work and installing concrete barriers.

Soldiers Road temporary closure

To allow us to carry out key work on the upgrade, we will close Soldiers Parade at the intersection with Campbelltown Road between **10pm Friday 25 October and 5am Monday 28 October**.

A detour will be in place via Camden Valley Way while Soldiers Road is closed in this area. Traffic will remain open for road users travelling straight through on Campbelltown Road.

Road users wishing to access Edmondson Park station from Campbelltown Road should continue through to Camden Valley Way towards Liverpool, and access Soldiers Parade from Camden Valley Way. Please

ensure you plan ahead and allow extra travel time for your journey if you are travelling to the station during this closure.

Our work schedule

We will be on site from **10pm Friday 25 October to 5am Monday 28 October**, weather permitting.

We are also continuing with our normal work schedule of five shifts per week Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm.

Clearly marked detours and traffic controllers will be in place to help road users complete their journeys.

You can add cheese and other extras for 50c each. Extra spoons and forks are 10c each. All ice blocks, watermelon cups, yoghurt cups, noodle cups and custard cups need to be collected from the canteen by the student as these will not be sent to their classroom to avoid any spillage. Healthy over the counter items are available daily and range from 50c to \$2.50, these will be displayed on the counter at lunch and recess.



What is Photo Journal?

Will other people be able to see these photos?

Australian Childhood Anxiety TREATMENT STUDY

Free home-based assessment and treatment for 7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families:

- A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- Your child receiving one of two kinds of home-based treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or tablet; and
- Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.

About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- The other treatment helps children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions in anxiety.
