# Message from the Principal

#### Dear Community,

The Bardia Public School uniform was selected by parents. I think you will agree that it is a fine looking uniform and a much better one than the yellow school uniform from Bardia's past.

Uniforms are important. They help the children to take pride in their school. They reinforce our behaviour policy by encouraging students to take responsibility for their appearance. These two things together have a significant impact on the tone of the school and impact student learning.

The only reason BPS has 99% of our students in the full, correct uniform is because of you, the parents and carers! However all it takes is a few students to wear something other than the uniform, a pair of red runners, a baseball cap, etc. and within a very short space of time other students will copy these uniform infringements and before you know it the school will end up looking like a dog's breakfast. Shoes and hats seem to be the worst items for infringements. Please, shoes that are all black is perfect, black and white are permitted. Only the correct school bucket had should be worn.

To help prevent lost items of uniform the school runs an embroidery service. All you have to do is drop the item of clothing (hats or jackets) into the office on a Friday morning and we will get them embroidered with your child's initials, noted in a register and back to your child by lunchtime (except at the beginning of the year when we are inundated). This is a FREE service!

Also, BPS has a no hat no play policy. Students without a hat will be told to play under cover and will not be permitted to play under direct sunlight. This is to prevent skin cancer, one of the only bad things about our beautiful country – very high rates of skin cancer.

Thank you so much for supporting your child's school and ensuring your child wears the correct school uniform every day!

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After some investigation (thanks to Mrs Gittoes our Office Manager) we have decided to end our association with Buzzy and commence using *School Stream*. I think you will be very happy with this app. It is very easy to use. It also gives parents more control over how the app functions.
