Message from the Principal

Dear BPS Community,

Welcome to the first of our 2021 newsletters. I trust you all had a wonderful time with your children over the summer break. A warm welcome to those of you who are new to our school and our community.

All schools are complex places, but BPS is particularly complex at the moment as we grow so rapidly with new enrolments. We now have over 800 students and 76 staff, not including our volunteers, cleaners or Camp Australia (which takes the number of people working at the school to about 100).

When we first took possession of our new facilities the staff and I made it our mission to retain our lovely school culture. So far we have been successful in this but we do face our challenges. COVID19 has remained stubbornly present and still impacts on how the school operates. I understand how frustrating this can be for you. Believe me when I say that the staff and I are equally frustrated. However, it is our responsibility is to ensure the safety of your children (and indirectly our community) while providing a high quality education, something we take very seriously.

On a brighter note we now have COVID19 vaccines, something we thought impossible only a few months ago. Slowly, the world will reduce the rate of contagion. Hang in there folks!

We now have Teacher Squads at BPS, which will cost approximately \$1 million. This is a unique program and as far as I am aware currently not at any other school in NSW. Put simply, we now have the equivalent of eight full time teachers who will go into the hubs to join with the two hub teachers to make a fourteacher squad. The students will be allocated a group depending on our assessment data. Each hub will have squads at different times, but a total of one day per week.

It is hoped that this intensive, individualised instruction will have a dramatically positive effect on our students' academic progress. Being able to provide such instruction (at the student's level of need) is a fantastic development at BPS. A warning though, this is so expensive we will probably only be able to afford this for two, perhaps three, years.

Dear Parents and Carers,

First, let me congratulate all the parents and carers who were so fantastic this morning in helping to make the arrival of the students smooth and reasonably safe. When we work together we can reduce the ever present danger of COVID-19 and ensure the children's education comes first in everything we do. Thank you!

Unfortunately reports in the media have only confused matters about the way different schools are to manage COVID19 and parents/carers are to enter the school.

There are many rules not mentioned by the media. For example: *Gatherings are limited to 30 people indoors and 30 people outdoors for schools within Greater Sydney including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast and Wollongong or 100 people outdoors for all other locations.*

The most important piece of information left out by the media is that different schools face different circumstances and therefore the final responsibility and decision in managing COVID-19 at each school rests with the Principal.

What needs to be appreciated is that BPS has two narrow entrances to the school. We can't use the entrance in Malaya Street yet. So in effect we could have 830 students, 78 staff (not including cleaners and Camp Australia) and approximately 800 parents and carers (about 1700 in total) squeezing into our two narrow entrances and congregating in the courtyard. A situation fraught with risk I am sure you will agree.

As far as parents entering the school goes I intend on always putting the safety of the community first and **parents remain barred from entering the school** except under special circumstances: going to the Admin Office, having important meetings with teachers, taking children to Best Start and the parents of students in our Support Unit taking their children to class.

One error that was in my communication with you yesterday I need to amend: masks are optional for parents at schools (but highly recommended); if you enter the school for one of the special circumstances mentioned above you MUST sign in using our visitor's book and you MUST sign in using a QR Code. These are Dept. of Health and Dept. of Education rules.

I have tried hard to think of a way to have the parents of our **Kindergarten** students more involved with that very important first day of school (next Wednesday) <u>and</u> comply with the COVID19 rules <u>and</u> keep everyone reasonably safe. I have a plan, but once again I am going to need your help.

1. Next Wednesday please bring your Kindergarten child/ren to school at 9.20am *not before*.

2. Wait on the footpath closest to the road near the COLA gates - at a good distance from other parents and carers. Wearing a mask is recommended.

3. At 9.30am you will be asked to enter the COLA a family at a time and asked to sit on the seats provided. Your child/ren can stand beside you.

4. A QR Code sign-in will be taken around to the seated parents and carers.

5. Your children will be escorted into the hall. Don't worry if your child refuses to leave you. We will sort that out - eventually.

6. The new classes (we call these hubs at Bardia) will be called out and you will be able to see your child/ren led away by their teachers and take some photos etc.

7. You will not be permitted to go with your child into the courtyard or to their class.

On Thursday 4th Feb and Friday 5th Feb ONLY you are asked to bring your child to school at 9.10am to the COLA gates. From Monday 8th February, Kindergarten will start school at 9.00am. The 2.50pm pick-up time for Kindergarten will remain in place until further notice.

For many of you Bardia Public School is new or your child commenced at BPS last year - not a normal year at all! You have hardly had time or the opportunity to get to know the staff or how the school functions.

Of course I am biased, but I am sure that in time 99% of you will come to agree that BPS is a fantastic school: great academic results, beautiful students, wonderful parents and carers and an exceptionally professional staff - the perfect school.

Trust takes time to build though, so I appreciate our new or newish parents not being quite there yet. Please take my assurance that I am not interested in blind bureaucracy. I always make decisions in the best interests of the students first, followed closely by the interests of the community. That is my duty of care.

Unfortunately I cannot always make decisions that satisfy every individual parent or carer. But I can promise you I will always do my best.

It is my strongest advice that if you have a complaint about teaching, learning or student behaviour that you communicate this to one of our Assistant Principals first (we have six Assistant Principals). If you have a complex complaint, ask to speak to a Deputy Principal (we have two Deputy Principals and they are my proxies). If they can't resolve the complaint it will be passed to me.

I am very much in demand these days so if you need to speak to me personally you can try your luck and simply ring or pop in, but it is probably better if you ring and make an appointment.

It is my strongest advice that you do not voice your complaints on Facebook or other social media or take your complaint to the commercial media. Every time this happens you damage your child's school. What harms your child's school harms your child.

While I am on that matter; we do have a Facebook page which we are about to close. We no longer use this to communicate and it is not monitored regularly by a member of staff. Once this is closed if parents or carers want to commence a Facebook page that is their right to do so, but the school will have nothing to do with it.

We have a very exciting year of teaching and learning ahead. Throughout this term I will be telling you more about all of the wonderful things happening at our school and how we intend on giving your children a learning boost that will be just incredible! We call this approach Teacher Squads and we intend on spending almost \$1 million to ensure its complete success! More on this later.

Library News

Welcome back to school and to those families new to Bardia we're so pleased you're here! We run many programs through the library so watch this space to get all the latest information.

At Bardia PS we aim through our library to make available the best possible resources, so the staff in collaboration with the teacher librarian, can provide learning experiences for the students to achieve their full potential in becoming capable and confident readers as well as independent, critical, efficient and successful users of information, who have developed a life-long love of reading and learning.

Borrowing

Each hub has a weekly, 1-hour, library session. During this session the children are allowed to borrow 2 books for one week. Children are only allowed to borrow for home if they have a library bag. We do this because the bag protects the books and isolates the books from your books at home or books from the local library. Over the first few weeks the students will discuss how to create habits around remembering their library bag and books. If a child does not have their library bag then we allow them to borrow the book for the classroom. The library is also open second half of lunch, each day, and children are welcome to borrow books at this time as well. Borrowing for home will begin next week.
