Message from the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

The Department of Education is currently negotiating a new Award with the Teachers Federation with the help of the Industrial Relations Commission.

On Tuesday 7th November the Teachers Federation have called on their members to take industrial action.

As a result of the strike our school will ONLY be providing minimal supervision of students on Tuesday 7 December.

This means that while there will be no normal teaching on that day, there will be minimal supervision available.

Our school will still operate in a COVID-safe manner in accordance with NSW Health guidelines.

I appreciate your patience and understanding during this disruption, especially given the challenges we have all faced this year. I will keep you updated on further developments as they come to hand.

A big thank you to our valiant P&C for manning the BBQs at Saturday's election. Money raised by your P&C is very much needed! Thanks to the P&C we now have a well-stocked music room. I will suggest to the P&C that for the foreseeable future funds raised should go toward our purchasing ICT devices (laptops and IPads). From the staff at BPS, we wish you a Merry Christmas (for those who celebrate) and hope that you all have a safe and enjoyable break with your children.
























































COVID-19

Thank you for working with us to ensure our community is kept safe by following our COVID-19 safety measures.



Pick up and drop off at Bardia Public School

We are continuing to have traffic issues at drop off and pick up times. Please ensure that you are keeping our students and community safe by driving safely and adhering to the road rules. We have had complaints from the greater community regarding dangerous crossing across Macdonald road and parents parking across or in private driveways. For your child's safety, please walk up to the intersection and cross safely at the traffic lights. Please respect our community and neighbours by parking your car in an appropriate location.

We are continuing to work with relevant stakeholders to push the approval and installation of the traffic lights at the corner of Arthur Allen Drive and Macdonald Road.

Road safety

Hold your child's hand

As pedestrians, children can be easily distracted and are often too small to be seen by drivers. They may be unable to predict or identify dangers and tend to act impulsively.

Talk with your child about safe behaviour on the footpath – it's not a safe place to play as it is near the road and vehicles may be entering or exiting driveways.

Until your child is at least eight years old, hold their hand:

- · on the footpath
- e in the car park
- · when crossing the road.

Up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road.

If you can't be with your child, organise for another trusted adult to accompany them.

After school, meet your child at the school gate. At the end of the school day children may be excited, distracted or tired and often not concentrating on their own safety.

Your guide to driving and parking safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
 Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- . Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- · At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.

Summer Reading Challenge 2021 - 2022

Studies have shown that children's reading skills can slide during the Summer school holidays, especially for those in low-socio economic families. Regular self-chosen reading, with support from families, can counter this decline. During the Summer school holidays, public libraries can provide ongoing learning by facilitating the borrowing of collection items and family support.

What is the Summer Reading Challenge at Liverpool City Library?

Reading is like playing a sport: the more children engage enjoyably with reading, the better they'll become at it. Our <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u> (SRC) aims to develop regular reading habits through a log that promotes reading at least 15 minutes daily.

The SRC aims to support all aspects of literacy over the summer. Children receive a pack with challenges that explore talking and listening, writing, as well as the reading log.

The SRC can be completed mostly online with <u>online registration</u>, access to our extensive <u>eLibrary</u> and <u>downloadable entry forms</u>. Children will need to visit the library to submit their entry forms.

Children will go into a draw for \$150 vouchers or other prizes when they complete any of the challenges and return them to their local library.

When is it being run?

It is running from **1 December 2021 – 4 February 2022** to overlap with the end and beginning of school terms

Summer Reading Club

The Summer Reading Club is coming to a Library near you from Wednesday 1 December 2021.

The Summer Reading Club is a program designed to encourage and promote reading and literacy during the Summer school holidays for children aged 0 - 14 years.

Parents can read to children who cannot read on their own.

How to register for the Summer Reading Club

 The Summer Reading Club will open on Wednesday 1 December 2021 and will run until Monday 31 January 2022, you can register at one of our libraries during this time.

How does the Summer Reading Club work?

- When joining the Summer Reading Club, children will be given a ▶ reading log (815KB, PDF) where they can record up to 10 books read or 10 periods of reading time.
- Children may read fiction or non-fiction, but all books should be suitable for their age level. Participants can also record books that are read to them.
- If a child is a member of <u>Bookalicious</u>, they can also add their books to their Bookalicious Reading Log as well.

Enter in the lucky draw

- When you complete a reading log, hand it in to one of our library branches to enter our lucky draw and you'll also receive a random lucky dip prize.
- Participants may request additional logs to continue reading and may enter the draw for every reading log they complete.
- There will also be some special prize draws along the way, so you will have the chance to win some other great prizes.

Road Safety Reminder!



Walking to and from school with your child helps ease traffic congestion, reduces your carbon footprint, promotes physical activity and provides a talking point about road safety.

When you walk with your child, talk about safe behaviour. Always demonstrate correct pedestrian behaviour. The best way you can help your child to be a safe pedestrian is to:

- give them lots of supervised practice with you or another trusted adult.
- talk with and teach your child about being alert in a road environment.
- always hold your child's hand.
- explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross the road.
- point out dangers, such as vehicles coming out of driveways.
- teach your child to keep turning their head in both directions to look and listen for traffic as they cross the road.
- talk with them about everything they need to think about to keep safe when walking.
- explain why they should look and listen before crossing a driveway, road or carpark.
- use the pedestrian refugee island correctly.
- talk with your child and reinforce Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross the road together.

REFUGE ISLAND

STOP! one step back from the kerb. LOOK! continuously look both ways. LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic. THINK! whether it is safe to cross.

Walking together also helps you to observe if older children are ready to cross the road independently.

By now all parents should have access to School Stream.


If you have downloaded the app and do not have access it is because your details do not match the details given on your child's enrolment. Mrs Zeeman sent an email to these parents today attaching a change of details form. Once received we will update our computer records and you will receive access automatically.

If you have not downloaded the app do so immediately. You will be missing out on vital information and notes. Detailed instructions on how to download the app are in the last few issues of the newsletter which is emailed to parents who have given their email address. One-to-one messaging between parents and teachers is still a couple of weeks away. We have been in negotiations with School Stream and will advise you as soon as it is available. 


1. Go to the App Store and download "School Stream" to your phone.


2. Open the app and type the school's name into the search bar to load the school's profile. 3. Make sure you agree to Push Notifications when prompted.

To order online please go to www.myschoolconnect.com.au. All online orders must be placed by 8am. If you miss this cut off time orders can be placed at the canteen by 9:00am. We accept cash & EFTPOS payments also. Sauces + Salad dressings are available for 50c each. Sandwiches can be toasted for an extra 50c and can also be changed to a wrap or bread roll for \$1. You can add cheese and other extras for 50c each. Extra spoons and forks are 10c each. All ice blocks, watermelon cups, yoghurt cups, noodle cups and custard cups need to be collected from the canteen by the student as these will not be sent to their classroom to avoid any spillage. Healthy over the counter items are available daily and range from 50c to \$2.50, these will be displayed on the counter at lunch and recess.



School Travel for 2022



2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

School Student Transport Scheme site change

On 1 October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to **transportnsw.info**. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one place.

Travel from Term 1 2022

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a difficult period for local bus operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations increasingly difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel on a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Please also remember that students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the <u>Student code of conduct</u> and <u>Opal terms of use</u>.
