Hi Everyone,

This week, Early Stage 1 have continued learning about seasons and getting ready for Summer by listening to and discussing the books, 'Perfect' and 'Jetty Jumping'. Year 1 have been enjoying their coding lessons with the Bee Bots. This week they continued learning about why we use code in computers and used code to direct the Bee Bots along a course to get to a destination. Year 2 have been learning how to use Google Docs and Microsoft Word to type a sentence, highlight and change the font style, size and colour. Stage 2 have been learning how to highlight key words in non-fiction texts and write dot points with summarised information for research and are enjoying the novel, 'Talking to Alaska'. Stage 3 are enjoying reading the verse novel titled, 'Worse Things' and continuing Digital Citizenship lessons. 
KOALA (Kids Own Australian Literature Awards)

We love celebrating various events in the library during the year. The event that children and teachers particularly enjoy is the annual Book Week in Term 3. Children can come to school dressed as their favourite book character and enjoy a week of fun activities celebrating books, including a Book Fair where parents have an opportunity to purchase books.

7 Resources for Families

The library has many resources available to families who are experiencing difficult circumstances and may need books that handle sensitive topics with care. Your librarians would be happy to assist you to locate these resources.

2 Library Bags

Waterproof library bags with our school logo are available for purchase from the school office for \$10. All students are encouraged to have a library bag for borrowing each week.

4 Library lessons

Each week your child will come to the library for a 1- hour library lesson. These lessons consist of borrowing for home and literature appreciation. A story is read and the children engage in an activity that supports classroom learning. Bardia Public School students love their weekly library visits!

6 Volunteering

We are always looking for parent volunteers to assist with book covering, shelving and general library duties. If you are available for any length of time on any day during the week, please contact us via the school. Assisting in the library can also lead to acquiring skills needed in the workforce. Mrs Wyber would be more than happy to provide a reference for anyone seeking employment.


